SPECIAL MEETS for the MISSION BAY MODEL YACHT BASIN:

The model yacht basin on Vacation Isle (west of Inghram St) is open to the public everyday, year 'round. The unspoken law, however, is scale electric and steam models on Saturday mornings, RC sail on Saturday afternoons, (generally there is no wind in the mornings, anyway), and high speed gas engine RC models all day on Sundays. These simple rules provide equal opportunity to share the limited number of RC frequencies available and reduce the threat of damage from possible high speed boats hitting or colliding with detailed scale models.

"FIRST" Model Yacht Basin "Show & Tell":

On Saturday, May 14, a "show & tell" display was set-up at the Model Yacht Basin which combined static displays of members with operating R/C electric, steam, and sail models of others. The word had been circulated widely among the "Saturday morning crowd" to all come down and bring as many models as possible regardless of current condition. The north bank of the basin at one point contained over 30 models at anchor and perhaps there were that many again displayed on the beach. Except for the southerly gusty winds which created choppy conditions, the day was regarded as a success. While it did not rain, the winds approached nearly gale force (in scale), for some of the smaller models.

Members displaying static models were: DAVE BASH ("Sultana & Rattlesnake"), LEW HARMELING (R/C live steam tug "Black Cat"), BOB BECKER ("Endevour & minitures of a British Admiralty yacht & Anchor Hoy"), DOUG MCFARLAND ("Norske Love & Santa Maria"), BILL BROWN (R/C Fireboat "City of L.A.#2 & sailing schooner Fergie"), BILL KELLY-FLEMING ("Flying Cloud, Hurricane Bird, Mediator, Constitution & Enterprise") FRED FRAAS (R/C electric of USS Camden (AOE-2) among others), and VIC CROSBY with his "Herring Siener" in a bottle, of course.

One of the days' highlights was the maiden voyage of a R/C live steam model of USS Oregon (BB-3) by JOHN SANDS. Although AL LHEUREUXS' 9 foot model of the USS MISSOURI (BB-63) was the largest operating model, an 8 foot model of the USS ENTERPRISE (CVAN-65) was present, a large model of USS FORRESTAL (CVA-59) as well as PHIL HEDLYS' 6 foot operating/diving model of a WWII Fleet Submarine. Several local newspapers gave appropriate picture coverage and Channel 39 apparently shot much footage, as did DAVE BASH. Perhaps his movies as well as many still shots will be seen at future meetings??
