

--The Trafalgar Project met prior to the Guild meeting. Progress continues and a target date for all models to be complete was set for the August meeting. Stay tuned. -- The Museum sponsored Festival of Sail is scheduled for 17 - 20 August. Twelve to sixteen sailing vessels are expected to be in San Diego for this event, but Bob Crawford reports there will be a lot more than just sailing vessels this year. Volunteers are needed for the three shifts per day and the various related events/activities. The model shop will be open during this event. We would LIKE to open a booth more accessible to the public but can only do so if we get enough If you would like to volunteers committed. volunteer for the model shop or model booth, contact Robert Hewitt.


New Business.

Bob Graham displayed his hand carved DOLPHINS trio. The base is walnut and the dolphins are bird's eye maple. The dolphin eyes are boxwood and ebony. The dolphins are held up by brass tube with piano wire inside the tube.





Don Dressel's YACHT MARY Photo by John Wickman


Don Dressel brought in three items for show and tell. First is

the YACHT MARY (above) which he completed back in 1984. It is from the Mamoli kit and it is pretty much out of the box, except for the linen sails, which are scratch. The ship's ornamentation is real gold leaf. A mermaid is encased with ship.

Don has made a 24 pound brass cannon (left) which will be used on a scratch built 1834, 42 foot armed longboat. The cannon will be fully functional and will be fired at least once...just because it can be.


Don is also working on a Yankee Model Works resin kit model of USS PORTER DD 356 (below). It is 1/350 scale.



H M FLY 1"=40 feet by Robert Hewitt

Hull number one is finished and placed in a carved tupolo wood sea. The model is in a picture frame base with a removable glass case. The flag halvard and the bowlines are made from .001" diameter copper wire. The sails are rice paper soaked in tea, they have linings and reef bands and reef points. Only the topmast studding sail is set as the lower would block the wind of the more efficient jib sails. The ship is shown on a beam reach. After John Wickman took this picture at the meeting, I carried the model, without its glass case, across the room. I bumped the ship into one of the decorator trees in our meeting room and knocked the gaff boom and ringtail sail and boom off. The next day the damage was repaired and the model sent off to Gus Agustin in Chicago. Gus took the model to the Midwestern Model Ships and Boats Contest at the Wisconsin Maritime Museum in Manitowoc. The model won a gold award. Hulls two and three along with masts, yards, cannon, and deck furniture are in a box, and may be there for quite some time.



Don Bienvenue decided to build a set of similar sized ship models (Scale 1:270) and put them in a shadow box display case. This is a nicely detailed plastic kit from HELLER with about 20 pieces. He got rigging plkans from **Chari Wessel**. He aged the wooden hull by applying a wash of black paint and black chalk pastel. This was covered with a coat of dullcoat. It was enjoyable and he is looking forward to the other HELLER mini-kits.

Let's All Go to the Fair

-- Be familiar with the information sheets and handouts available at the booth. In addition to those, we have included catalogues and old newsletters to show people who interested or who have questions about kits etc. Familiarize yourself with some of the basic kits and their good and bad points.

-- Take time to listen to your boothmates when they talk. I must admit, I have learned a thing to two at the Fair myself.

--Make sure to sign in and out. Get around to see the Fair and have a good time.
