

ANOTHER VISITOR IN PORT

One of the largest tall ships is in port. the JUAN SEBASTIAN DE ELCANO snuck into port a few hours after the NEW JERSEY on April 1. Suffering from mechanical problems and too much wind off shore, she has found San Diego a harbor of haven prior to her scheduled April 13 visit.

Built in 1921, the four masted topsail schooner, J.S.deELCANO carries about 100 crew members, is a lengthy 113 meters long and masts just under 290 feet. And, if you look closely, some of her masts double as smoke stacks.

Berthed at Broadway Pier, her crew has colorful ceremonies, complete with band for flagraising at 8a.m. and retreat. At 7pm the crew recites in unison the prayer printed at our masthead. Roughly translated it means: You who commanded the wind and sea/make calm, the storm/ have mercy Lord. Thus the crew keeps alive a tradition dating back to 1519.


Note: The above dates are all Saturdays. All of these events are also scheduled on Sundays. Additionally, 4 June will probably be used by the school kids for their annual free sail day.
