#### LOG OF THE JUNE 1987 MEETING

The meeting was kept brief with the membership epected to be on hand early the next morning for the annual regatta. Among the brief announcements was that George Oliver (a past regatta commodore) was down with pneumonia. A get well card was signed to be sent to him. Bob Cornell gave a demonstration of the basics in soft and silver soldering. Several members of other clubs in town for the regatta were welcomed.

SHOW AND TELL

VIC CROSBY brought anther bottle, this time filled with a 1:350 scale seaplane of the early bi-plane with pontoon style.

BILL PAYLOR brought in a model originally built by Vernon English of a 27" Veronica Sail boat which was never completed and now has a hole in the hull.

NORMAN HIATT's latest effort ia the sternwheeeler MERRIVILL,  $4\frac{1}{2}$  feet in length, scratch built from pine, mahogonay door skin and aircraft ply.

JOHN FRY was the hit of the evening with his LST 542 in 1:96, scratch built. This replica of the 1943, 2nd generation landing craft will hit the beach, bow doors opening, ramp dropping, and then a tank coming out onto the beach (with the help of a piano wire. It operates at a scale 11 knot speed. A very impressive model.

MIKE RIVERA broght in a 14 year old model of the harbour tug SAMSON from a Billings kit. This 28" model is a planked hull built for radio control.

As usual, DOUG MCFARLAND brought in HOTSPUR, which he claims is 88.7641138 % complete. Next time we expect at least 1.4657867% improvement!

Things are a little quieter up here in my perch overlooking the Port and the worrld of ship modeling. June was sure a busy month though, as I reported last time. Even from up here I had to look way up to see the top of the WINDSONG's masts! The port pilots were sure busy while she was here, not only bringing her in and out with four three hour excursions, but they had a total of 15 moves that Friday and about 10 on Saturday. For San Diego that is a lot of work! The WINDSONG is the second of four sister ships, with WIND SPIRIT and WIND SURF on the ways in France. Another French company is also planning for two sailing cruise ships in the next few years. While I am on the subject of cruise ships, I can see on the horizon of the future, nine

cruise ships totaling 400,000 GRT on order for delivery in the next two years and five other about to be ordered with a total increase in capacity of 15,000 passengers! I also see a bunch of sad Norwegian seafarers as eight Norwegian registered cruise ships have just been reflagged to the Bahamas.

The new model maker on the QUEEN MARY is Thomas A. C. Hershey, who is the former modelmaker of the Navy's exhibit center in Washington D.C.

I had a call from Dave Shield of Dana Book & Navigation, 24402 Del Prado, in Dana Point. His shop specializes in books on vessels and on model making.
