



#### My Ferspective

Shipmates, as the Regatta Commodore I have encountered some interesting situations; complacency, closed ears, and lost initiative to name a few. We go along with our life and do not take notice of what is going on around us. So when things happen, (REMEMBER THE ARIZONA), we bitch, complain, yell, etc. Now things that we once took for granted are not what they really are. Take for example, SDMC 63.02.13, (see attachment). This regulation and the rest of them regulate what can be done while at any public park. The things that we have done for years can not be done legally. Some say, "just do it anyway. They will look the other way. They haven't enforced it yet". Well what happens when they do enforce it? Who takes the heat? Let me tell you it will be all the modelers that use the pond and the surrounding area. Why the use permit? With out it anyone that wants to run his boat while any of the clubs are having a function at the pond can do so and we do not have the right to ask them to leave. In order to get things changed so we can operate at the pond all the model clubs that use the pond are going to have to speak with the Park Authority in a united front.

There are those out there that question why we need to be organized, deal with issues, talk about business at meetings, breathe, live, etc. By God, San Diego Ship Modeler's Guild is WORTH THE FIGHT. The Guild has had a few people that have run the club and made things happen. Some of them are gone. Some are just burned out. Because the Guild was run so loosely with not enough attention being paid to business there will be some rough seas ahead. We have to be ready to weather them.

There are those that would like the meetings to have less business and more modeling tips. If that is the case then why is it so hard for the newsletter editor to get articles for the newsletter? When his job took him away he asked for help with the newsletter. Why did no one speak up to help? Why is it so hard to find where to get the items like letter heads, guild logos, etc? These are all questions that have to be asked and the answers are vague at times. The guild has taken a new course. Change, the one thing no one likes to do, is upon us. It will be interesting to see where this leads. I expect that the Guild will come out far ahead and will be stronger because of the new course upon which we are embarking.

#### RULES AND REQUIATIONS GOVERNING PARK USE PERMITS

1. Park areas cannot be reserved for the exclusive use of any one group, and access the area by the general public must be available at all times. (No roping off of area, etc.)

. All motor vehicles are to be restricted to roadways. Vehicles are not permitted on

lawns, beaches and park walks at any time.

- 3. Cleanup and proper disposal of litter and debris generated by participants in the activity is the responsibility of the Permittee. Please place refuse in the dumpsters in the park for disposal. Failure to provide adequate cleanup could result in the Permittee being required to post a bond for cleanup to obtain a permit for a future event.
- 4. Staging, platforms, etc., shall not damage turf or shrubbery.

5. Picking flowers or damaging shrubs, plants and trees is prohibited in accordance with SDMC Sections 63.02.4 and 63.02.6.

- 6. Amplification for music and/or voice projection requires special permission of this office and the City Noise Abatement Officer. AMPLIFIED MUSIC IS PERMITTED ONLY AT /MARINER'S PT., HOSPITALITY PT., AND DOG BEACH.
- 7. Selling or offering for sale any goods, wares, merchandise, or articles whatsoever is prohibited in accordance with SDMC Section 63.02.13. (No money is to exchange hands/no merchandise is to be bought or sold during your event on City property. Ticket sales must be handled in advance.)
- 8. Dogs are not permitted on the beach or adjacent park areas between 9:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. Before 9:00 a.m. or after 6:00 p.m., dogs are allowed if on a leash. Dogs are allowed at any hour at Fiesta Island and the Flood Control Channel (North Ocean Beach) in accordance with SDMC Section 63.20.12.
- 9. Glass containers of any kind, including champagne bottles, are prohibited on the beach and all park areas in accordance with SDMC Section 63.02.8.
- 10. All fires must be contained within the concrete fire rings or barbeques provided by the City. Portable barbeques are permitted but care must be taken not to damage any grass areas and coals must be emptied into fire rings, permanent barbeques, barbeque coal dispensing rings or taken home in accordance with SDMC Section 63.02.11.
- 11. The Park and Recreation Department cannot modify maintenance schedules (i.e.; lawn renovation, fertilization, aeration) to accommodate events in public parks. Maintenance activities are normally scheduled between 6:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m.
- 12. Horseshoes, baseball, football, lawn darts, croquet, and other potentially hazardous games may be played only in courts/fields designated for this purpose by the Park and Recreation Department in accordance with SDMC Section 63.02.17.
- 13. Municipal Code Section 63.02.1 states "DISTRIBUTION, POSTING OF HANDRHIS, ETC. PROHIBITED. To distribute, circulate, give away, throw or deposit in or on any of
  said parks or plazas any handbills, circulars, pamphlets, tracts, dodgers, papers or
  advertisements; or post or offer or affix to any tree, fence or structure situated
  within any such park or plaza any handbills, circulars, pamphlets, tracts, dodgers,
  papers or advertisements."

14. The City of San Diego, Mission Bay Park/Ocean Beaches and Shoreline Parks, does not furnish the following utilities: a. Water hook-up; b. Electric service. DO NOT TAP INTO THE IRRIGATION LINES (QUICK COUPLERS); THE WATER IS CONSIDERED CINIAMINATED.

15. Water balloons are no longer permitted (due to the water conservation effort). Egg tosses are permitted with PLASTIC EGGS ONLY. Food tosses, of any kind, are not permitted.

16. As provided in the "authorized uses" provision of this permit/lease, the property shall be used exclusively for the purposes specified. The premises shall not be utilized for the purpose of working or campaigning for the nomination or election to any public office be it partisan or nonpartisan. Provided, however, that he permittee/lessee shall not be precluded from providing a forum for open public decate by candidates such as occurs at a "candidate forum" and similar events.






