

BEGINNERS SHIP MODEL APPRAISING:

The following article appeared in the Jan/Febr '94 issue of MODEL SHIP BUILDER. (The Guild's copy is available in the Model Shop aboard the Berkeley.) Several years ago the late Cdr. Bill Benson once told this writer that as a very rough "rule" he used in estimating the price of a proposed model, he used \$100 an jnch or \$1,000 a foot as a general rule. Might be an interesting topic for discussion at a future guild meeting which is why this is included in this newsletter.

The Editor's Log

A question that is often asked is "how much is my ship model worth?". My first response is, "whatever you can get". Prices of finished ship models range all over the board. There is no real set rule to pricing, though experience and accuracy bring the higher prices. If you can build a ship model in 14 days with \$25 worth of materials and sell it for \$10,000, then more power to you.


Most modelers don't sell their ship models, but need an estimate for insurance purposes. I have found that two rules of thumb work as a starting point for those who have never sold (or priced) their ship models.

- 1. If the model is a kit and you have done a reasonable job of following the instructions, then your formula for pricing should be five times the price of the kit. Thus, a \$100 kit would worth \$500. If you did significant research on the ship and made historically correct changes (that can be documented) then add 25% to the formula. This makes the selling price \$625. If you feel you changed more than 40% of the kit during construction, then use rule of thumb #2.
- 2. If the model is scratch built and historically accurate, start with the following information: cost of materials and the number of hours it took to complete the project. Determine the hourly rate (take the average hourly rate of your current/or last full-time job as a good indicator, then deduct 75%). Nobody said this would be a fair price, but it does work out

realistically compared to known sales. If it took you 800 hours to build the model and you earn \$12/hour, then the number is \$2,400 (\$12-75% = \$3: \$3 x 800 = \$2,400). Take this number and add to it your cost of materials, this will give you an average worth of your model.

Building time should be considered as the time sitting in front of the model doing actual construction. Research time, time buying materials, time setting up your workshop and the time just staring at the plans don't count in this formula. Like I said, its not fair, but its real.

These formulas are only for the beginner modeler, or for the modeler who has never sold a model before. There are modelers who have sold models for much more, however, they have the proven track record. This is only the starting point.

WESTERN SHIP MODEL CONFERENCE AND EXHIBIT

The first WESTERN SHIP MODEL CONFERENCE AND EXHIBIT will be held on-board the R.M.S. Queen Mary at Long Beach, California on March 25, 26, and 27, 1994. The conference is being hosted by the Ship Modelers Association.

The conference will begin with a reception on Friday evening, March 25, in the Queen Mary Exhibition Hall, where static displays of period and modern ship models, as well as scale radio control ship models can be viewed. Participants are invited to show their models during the conference. Models are requested to arrive any time on Thursday, March 24, but will also be accepted on Friday.

Prominent speakers will address various subjects of interest to model makers and maritime enthusiasts on Saturday, March 26. That evening, there will be a banquet dinner in the Queen Salon. Informal round table discussions will be held on Sunday.

Vendors of books, supplies, and tools will be present all three days to show, discuss, and sell their products.


