August Meeting

The August meeting was our annual Guild Birthday Party, this year held aboard HMS Surprise on a warm and beautiful San Diego Summer evening, highlighted by our own private Red Bull Airshow, as four aircraft representing the upcoming air races put on a fine show of formation flying. There was plenty of refreshments and comradery. About the only thing that could have improved the evening was to get underway. Now that we have our Coast Guard certificate of Inspection, that could soon be a reality. The following pages are some random photos of the event and photos of what we would like to end up with when our San Salvador project is complete.

SAN SALVADOR Project

Team members met informally to discuss progress. John Wickman, who prepared and cut the bulkheads and center piece, (then assembled them) gave Bob McPhail his team's model which is now at the "bulkheaded" stage. He also provided masts/bowsprit which he made. Dave Dana showed a "ready" set of windows which will run along each side of model. He will make two more sets. Howard Griffus showed a completed transom decoration. Howard will provide additional transom decorations to the other teams. Dave will work with crosses he has to test fit them to the transoms and possible paint the transom. Dave also showed deck grating which proved satisfactory for the models. He will put coaming around the gratings. Gratings were made out of Material which was obtained from a yardage store. Howard Griffus was asked to obtain eighteen cannon for the models (six per model). He will try to make them or purchase them from "THE DROMEDARY". Bob McPhail distributed wood for the models to the teams. Wood pieces consisted of a mixture of walnut, aspen, cherry, and basswood. Bob also gave the teams a listing of the dimensions of wood pieces and their "intended" use. Bob discussed the half models with Don Bienvenue. It was decided that different wood would be needed for their completion using the "lift" (bread and butter) method. Don will determine the six half model wood requirements and give the request to Bob Crawford.

There will be a team meeting before the regularly scheduled September meeting at 6:00 PM.

Mr. Brian Collard (not a member) wants someone to build a sixty four inch long r/c model of the CASTOR. He has the plans and is interested in pricing at this time. He is also searching for plans of a cargo vessel SD 14. You may reach him at 785-342-5991.

The conference chair is Dr. Raymond E. Ashley, Executive Director of the Maritime Museum of San Diego. Participating organizations include: The San

Scope and Purpose:

The Maritime Heritage Conference is a triennial event designed specifically for those from all walks of life interested in maritime culture, history, and heritage. It gives the opportunity for researchers in the manifold aspects of the story of human interaction with oceans, seas, and waterways, to share their knowledge and enthusiasm for this integral part of our history. Specialists in maritime history, education, the preservation of historic vessels, marine sanctuaries, underwater archaeology, as well as interested amateurs will have the opportunity to socialize, exchange experiences and ideas, and learn from each other. This will occur through formal receptions, keynote addresses, and close to 200 individual papers to be delivered at more than seventy panels.

The Conference Program:

In line with the scope and content of previous Maritime Heritage Conferences, the San Diego conference will focus on a broad array of topics. The conference's official Call for Papers has now expired. The response from member organizations and interested individuals has been truly phenomenal. Member organizations have contributed more than thirty panels. Added to this, over 100 individual papers have been submitted. Conference attendees can expect a program of more than 70 different panels to choose from. The organizers expect as many as 500 attendees. The conference will officially commence with a welcome reception on the *Star of India* on the evening of Tuesday October 9, 2007. For the next three days, October 10 through 12, conference participants will have the opportunity of selecting from more than 70 different break-out sessions. The proceedings will officially conclude with a twilight dinner cruise on San Diego Bay. Both the welcome reception and the dinner cruise are included with full registration.

To make the forthcoming conference a truly memorable occasion, the conference organizers have put in place a series of events to highlight the many faces of maritime heritage.

On Monday October 8th, the day before conference registration begins, the World War II Victory Ship SS *Lane Victory* will sail from San Pedro near Los Angeles to San Diego. The United States Merchant Marine Veterans of World War II (USMMVWWII) have graciously offered to transport conference attendees **free of charge** from San Pedro to San Diego. Attendees will also have

the option of returning to Los Angeles on board the *Lane Victory* on the morning of Monday October 15. She will be berthed alongside the Maritime Museum of San Diego for the duration of the conference and will form an integral part of the conference venues. We are pleased to announce that two specialists in maritime heritage, Ian Toll and Alex Roland, will deliver keynote addresses at the conference.
